Catch grate exhibit 'Water Reflections' at Toho Water Authority Around Osceola

When was the last time you saw "grate" art? If your answer is never, here's an opportunity. "Water Reflections" is the name of the exhibit currently on display until the end of May at Toho Water Authority, 851 Martin Luther King Blvd., Kissimmee. The exhibit features the work of Poinciana resident Bobbi Mastrangelo, often referred to as "The Grate Artist." Mastrangelo uses grates, grids and manhole covers as the foundation of her clever artwork. Her intricate designs focus on themes such as anti-litter and conservation. In an almost-Andy Warhol way, Mastrangelo makes these utilitarian manhole covers appear pop-art-like, but with a subtle message of environmentalism.

Mastrangelo moved to Solivita in 2004 from Long Island, N.Y. She was an elementary school teacher who chose to take a break from teaching and dedicated herself to the role of stay-at-home mom. Then the teacher became the student.

Mastrangelo returned to school, taking art courses at SUNY-Stony Brook and Suffolk Community College, both in New York. It was during that period she discovered her niche—working her art around circular design then eventually to authentic manhole covers. Mastrangelo is recognized in Who's Who in American Art and has had her work displayed at Baltimore Public Works and the New York Hall of Science.

The grate artist demonstrates creativity and vision through her work. Stop by Toho Water Authority and be inspired.
